- 2.2 in order to get constructive feedback on your homework you have to attend office hours. I would prefer turning in written homework and having the graded homework returned to the class.
- Dr. Pieters has come to class prepared every day. There was never a class where I felt like my time was wasted or that I was not learning something new. This class was one of those classes where I'm so involved that the period ends before I get a chance to check my watch to see how much time is left.

I thought grading on homework and test was quite fair. In some cases I felt that I was given more credit than I deserved for an answer on an exam, but really that just shows Dr. Pieters' bountiful mercy toward the student body.

I've never had such an easy time getting to a professor's office hours. Ever.

- Dr. Pieters is always well prepared for class. The topics are outlined online beforehand and she follows a strict schedule. Her exams are difficult, but she grades very fairly and offers "reward points" to help soften the blow of the grade without dumbing down the material. She

is incredibly accessible during her office hours, and was careful to take our opinions into account, issuing a midterm evaluation that she then used to alter her lesson plans.

- Dr. Pieters was always available for help during office hours and was very fair when grading.
- Dr. Pieters was very approachable in office hours, always willing to go over topics and questions that I did not yet understand. Her classroom preparation was excellent as well - the notes she wrote on the board were always relevant but not overwhelming.
- Dr. Pieters did an excellent job of helping us understand the concepts of microeconomics

- The instructor is extremely helpful during class and office hours. The grading might be strict at times (if there is a technical difficulty for example), but it is generally fair and reflective. The instructor is very smart and seems to know what she is talking about.

2.7) Please comment on your answers to questions 2.5 and 2.6.

- A lot of the material in this course was not very easy for me to wrap my head around. I definitely had to think differently and review the material to keep it all straight, but I enjoyed the challenge and Professor Pieters did a great job in making really difficult material understandable.
- Although I have learned some of the things in high school, there are still many new techniques that will be helpful for my future major.
- Dr. Pieter's course is based on quantifiable aspects of economics, but she still expects us to apply these concepts and explain them in the written word as well. We don't just memorize formulas, we have to thoroughly understand why and how they function the way they do. As someone with no experience in economics, I feel like I learned an incredible amount about the subject in just one semester, and that my understanding is very thorough and not easily forgotten.
- Every class includes new useful knowledge for future assignments and overall economic understanding.
- Helped me view the smaller details in economics not seen when taking micro.
- I am not a natural when it comes to economics, but I was definitely forced to move past my preconceptions and work hard to really learn the concepts.

- the teacher is fair and understanding and does a good job of explaining concepts in ways that students will understand. she genuinely wants the students to learn the material and do well in the class.

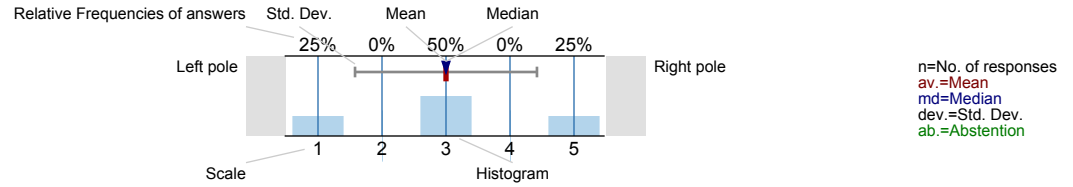

- Always friendly in office hours and helpful. Love her sense of humor and that she plays zelda and videogames!
- Dr. Pieters always has notes of her graphs and other class notes so she knows where she's going. We've never been pressed to learn material before midterms or anything like that. She also mentioned once that she grades page by page so she doesn't know whose paper she's grading in an attempt to be as fair as possible.
- Dr. Pieters is a good professor. No nonsense, but is very effective at transferring the ideas from her mind to ours.
- I've never felt that the instructor is unorganized at all. She has a system that works for her and she sticks to that system. I think her grading is as fair as it can be and she is available and helpful outside of class. I never got the impression that I couldn't get help if I need it or that I was graded unfairly in anyway.
- Instructor always available and willing to help. She went out of her way to explain home works and not simply give the answers away, the instructor clearly cares about her students understanding economics .
- Office hours are great because she does not just give students the answers; instead, she assists you in using logic to get through them. I really appreciated that.
- Pieters is well prepared, her pre-class notes are available online, and she follows a pretty similar structure for each lesson. She has a grading system that seems to be fair and compensate for a mistake on one of the tests for the semester. If you approach her in office

hours she will really take the time to break down the subject for you, and she is always willing to help.

- She is a fair grader, but very picky in what she wants. Always willing to help

- As an engineering I have to take micro Econ. I thought the material was interesting and manageable. My only major concern with the class was the length of the tests given the class time. I think some of the tests were unreasonably long.
- Class is not too bad. I could have done better if I allotted more time to this class as opposed to my other courses.
- Definitely my hardest course this semester. I was often lost and confused, but going into office hours really helped me out. A lot of my semester was spent on trying to do the homework.
- Dr. Pieters is too cool. She teaches the subject in a way everyone understands and the class group work allows for good collaboration. The course is tough but manageable if you pay attention in class and are understanding the homework.
- Dr. Pieters was an extremely effective professor in teaching this course. The course was very well organized and there was just the right mix between lectures, group work, individual work, and exams.
- I did not expect this course to be as difficult as it was (my most difficult), but I have no regrets on taking the class. - Very effective teacher and I would highly recommend this course to everyone.

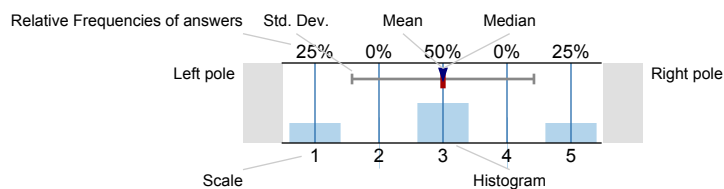

The midterm was an interesting experiment, but even not considering how we did on the grading exercises, the whole thing felt like it took too long.
- I feel I have learned a lot and I really enjoyed this class.
- I had a good experience in the class. The subject was interesting and I feel like I learned a lot.
- I really liked the class, I personally believe that I learned so much by writing the paper.
- I took this class as my last requirement for my economics major. I feel like the course is as difficult as I thought it would be although I am pleasantly surprised with Gina as a professor. She is very prepared, organized and structured the class well. While I am not great at economics, I understood most of the class. I wish however, the class was more example based rather than straight teaching.
- I took this class because I needed upper division economics hours to fulfill my major. I thought it would be easier than some of the other classes being offered. It wasn't. But, I found it much more interesting than I thought it would be
- International Trade is a class that should either be taught at an introductory level or an advanced level. Either is a reasonable difficulty level for the class. What transpired here was a class of advanced students dealing with an introductory professor. Professor Pieters seems confused about the role of this classroom: whether it is to teach us basic introductory economics 101 (we spent nearly 2 weeks on the basic fundamentals of comparative advantage), or to demand we produce papers in the style one might find in a published economic journal. The content of the class is so scattered that it was nearly impossible to predict what was expected in homework or tests.
- It was an interesting class and I hope it would be more case based like we did at the end of the semester. However, the theory part was good as well. It would be interesting to have a different type of final because we have not done something like is expected in the end by ourselves.
- The class was a bit tough to follow. Lacked structure which detracted from learning the material.
- The whole experience is okay. I did learn a lot. Dr. Pieters is new to Trinity so I didn't set my expectation too high.
- This class was very informative. I felt like I actually learned a lot about trade models and international relations in general. It was a difficult class but not unmanageable
- This course was a challenge for me. The models were pretty complicated and it felt like we really flew through them at the beginning and as a result I have been kind of fighting for my life the whole semester. The problem sets are a bit ridiculous. Maybe I was doing something wrong, but they took me several hours (in one instance, over 10 hours) and I still felt unsure of them. Sometimes the classroom felt kind of scattered and confusing and it made it hard to engage with the material being presented.

- Always willing to accommodate outside class hours.
- Dr. Pieters is ridiculously intelligent. Like almost too smart. I spent a significant amount of time outside of class in her office hours getting help on homework and she is very helpful. Her dedication to her students is uncommon- I kept her until 6pm on a Friday evening and she was happy to help me as long as I needed it.
- Gina is ALWAYS available in office hours and she is ALWAYS helpful and grades perfectly. I truly have no complaints.
- Grades work really fast and that is really appreciated as a lot of teachers take their time. She gives good feedback and tries to help others as well.
- I didn't take enough advantage of office hours, but there were times that the instructor felt unorganized. This became less and less of a problem over the course of the semester though.

- I thought Dr. Pieters was organized and helpful.
- Let me be clear: Gina Pieters may be one of the most unprepared professors I have ever seen. Countless days have been spent in class with her unable to make sense of her own homework questions. Entire periods have been spent watching her work away at a whiteboard completely baffled by simple models SHE HERSELF introduced to the class. It was shocking to me to see a professor stare at a homework question for 45 minutes only to conclude she would "get back to us" about it, when the homework itself was due in less than 12 hours. Evaluation of work was impacted heavily by my earlier criticism that the difficulty of the class (and what was expected) changed dramatically from assignment to assignment. Often what was returned on the homework was unintelligible red checks or "x"s with no linkage to advice or explanation of what was wrong. While Gina was often available outside of class, she was rarely helpful, typically abdicating teaching responsibility to another student in the class (who often had little idea what to do), or continuing with her patented system of having no idea what the answer to her own homework was.
- She had office hours. She graded fairly.
- She was willing to help me outside of class on homework and other assignments. She came to class well prepared and organized. We received our homework and test at a fast turn around.

- The only thing that really should be changed is when we write our own test questions they should be turned in a week or so earlier than the test so that they are fully correct.

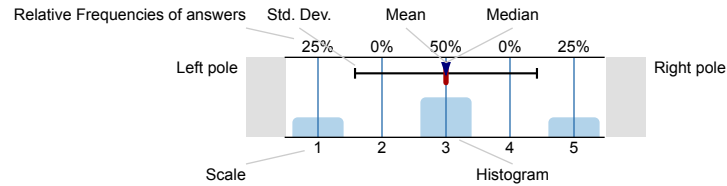

1. Background Questions

^{1.7)} Considering your selections above, please comment on your experience in this course.

- Dr. Pieters is very nice and ALWAYS willing to help. She will sit with you in office hours for as long as you need, help you on homeworks, and even stay after class to discuss the class notes from that day. However, Microeconomics is not an easy class. It was very challenging for me to try to understand these economic principles, and I did not think it would be that hard to learn the basics. The tests were very challenging, especially to get them done in a short amount of time. I always had problems with the short answers because sometimes I had difficulty seeing the whole picture. Also, class moves pretty fast, and it was often hard for me to keep up. However, I am one of those people who need to sit and let things soak in in order to fully understand them.
- Dr. Pieters provided a comfortable learning environment that was never intimidating, but also was not lax. - Again, the instructor is always easy to understand. No complaints. I would recommend this course to a friend.
- As I said earlier, she asks a variety of questions and recognizes that different people learn differently and because of that, no one type of learner is tested unfairly.
- Dr. Pieters is an amazing teaching and is fantastic at conveying her knowledge onto us. She is always super well prepared for class and even though the material and class are difficult, she is a good teacher.
- Dr. Pieters is tricky, which I like, but she teaches effectively. She teaches in a very linear way. I especially liked her use of the whiteboard in presenting concepts (each class has a "roadmap" of what will be covered on the board and a quick review of the previous class concepts before moving on to new notes. I like this format).
- I feel as if you either like economics or you don't. I really didn't embrace the field of study in the beginning of the semester; however, Dr. Pieters has gotten me to grow to like it a little more. She is always positive, and she is definitely passionate about what she teaches. I wish there would of been some more in-class experiments because that helped me greatly when we did those a few times.
- I think the way she grades certain problems is unfair, mostly the definition and critical thinking problems. For example, my way of thinking may not be her way of thinking and I can prove I understand the concept, but she will not give credit back even if you tell her where your head was at when taking the test or doing the homework.
- If you're not getting something, she will go over it again as many times as you need for you to understand the material.
- Pieters style of teaching was very clear and methodical. Everything she wrote on the board was helpful and important to the class.
- The instructor is very effective and runs the course at a great pace to make sure everybody understands the material. She is very clear with explaining the material and gives everyone the opportunity to do well in the class.
- The teacher is effective for people who naturally understand economics. She moves way too quickly for the people that don't have a good understanding of economics, and is sometimes hard to follow in lecture. This course should be taught for people that are more advanced than beginners, because it goes into way more detail than other micro courses and is much more difficult. Much of the lecture is not on the test, and the questions on the test are very complicated.

Comments Report

1. Background Questions

^{1.7)} Considering your selections above, please comment on your experience in this course.

- Absolute worst course and professor at Trinity. I have never spent more time on a course in my entire years at Trinity. I got a 100 on the midterm and am expecting an A in this course yet I have learned absolutely nothing as this course has been a colossal waste of time. Dr. Pieters was often distracted and inconsistent with her lectures. There were actually times when I would turn in the EXACT SAME homework assignment as fellow classmates (she allowed this) but would receive different grades. This happened in about four different occasions. Because homeworks were material I used to study with, it was impossible to differentiate right from wrong because of the difference of grades between classmates, and the difference between what she said during class versus her explanations in office hours. Usually I would walk away from office hours with more questions than answers because she would consistently tell us something different than what she taught in class. I usually do not ever participate in course evaluations but I feel it is absolutely necessary that some sort of action be taken. Students should not have to endure such rigor if they are not getting any knowledge out of it. I do not think students should be subjected to a professor who's only concern is getting tenure. This fact was obvious throughout the duration of the semester as Dr. Pieters often told us of her stress and distracted state of mind involved with her research.
- Course was definitely a good learning experience and encouraged critical thinking
- I really enjoyed this course. I feel that Dr. Pieters' grading standards are clear and more than fair. The weekly homeworks allowed me to apply the concepts discussed into current economic situations. The term paper allowed me to study in-depth a topic in which I had much interest. The knowledge I gained while researching my topic is invaluable.
- I really enjoyed this course. Throughout this course I have learned many skills I hope to apply later on. I really liked the articles we read and the questions that made us apply our knowledge in real world applications
- I thoroughly enjoyed this class. While the workload wasn't too heavy, the coursework was very challenging and intellectually stimulating. For anyone interested or intrigued by the way money works and operates on a global spectrum, this is a must take course. The theory combined with the mathematical application makes the class interesting and understandable. Dr. Pieters did a wonderful job at making the information relevant.
- It was not that easy but by doing homeworks , I learned alot.
- The weekly homework assignments helped with understanding the material. However, they could be confusing and demanded a lot of time outside class. The professor was available during office hours, but there were always a lot of people there and made it somewhat uncomfortable. Most of my classmates had trouble with the assignments.
Recommendation for the future: go over a similar example in class so we have a better base to do the homework.
- This course was difficult because it has been a long time since I took an economics class and therefore it required me to spend more time on the assignments. I took it because my International Affairs major required it.
- This was the hardest class I have taken at Trinity. It was taught in a way that the professor expected the entire class to know the material prior to ever taking the course. I have never spent so much time and effort on any other course during my entire three and a half years at Trinity. Weekly homeworks were given. I would spend over 6 hours on each assignment, sometimes more. The midterm was based majorly on questions asked by the students. I found this ineffective as the professor is supposed to be the one teaching, not the students themselves. After over 28 hours of studying, two all nighters, and increased stress levels, I walked away with a 100 on the midterm. The material itself was difficult enough, but the fact that we lacked any instruction whatsoever made things much more difficult. As Dr. Pieters is pressured to receive her tenure, I and several other classmates expressed her lack of concern for our class. She was always preoccupied with a personal matter and was on several occasions inconsistent with what she taught in class and what she said in office hours. There were COUNTLESS times when I would go to office hours and she would actually ask to see my notes because she kept explaining the material differently than what she had originally taught in the lecture. I have never experience a more unprepared, distracted, and frustrating professor. During the first half of the semester I would actually go to office hours of other past professors that I have had. For one homework assignment I spoke with three different professors.

- Dr. Pieters has weekly office hours and is available to meet outside of them if students need be. Her grading is fair and constructive. Replacement points allow students to make up for lost points. While many students expressed disappointment in this course, I feel that this class is very fair. Class lectures have clear structures.
- Dr. Pieters is well prepared for each session. She critics your work and explains why you've made your mistake and how to correct it. She accessible during her office hours and through appointments.
- Dr. Pieters takes instruction very seriously. Wants her students to learn and be successful.
- Dr. Pieters was always encouraging people to come to her office hours and that was really helpful.

In class, she would get confused several times with the material which also confused the students. She would later clarify the theory but it was harder to keep up.

- Sometimes the grading (particularly on the paper) can be a little harsh but Dr. Pieters is determined to help you do your best.

- This was a great course and I highly recommend it to any student who is interested in international economics.

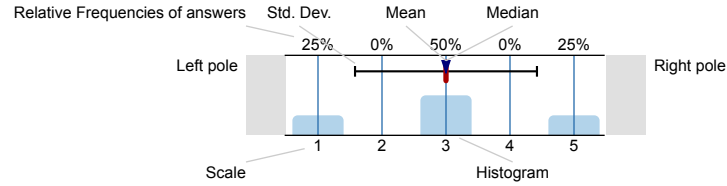

- Although much of the material is difficult for me to comprehend initially, Dr. Pieters manages to break it down in a way that makes it far more accessible.
- International Trade is one of the hardest courses I have ever taken at Trinity and I'm still managing to enjoy myself. Lectures are fast-paced and focused. Dr. Pieters has a great deal to teach us and is able to illustrate the points she is making using both in theoretical models and descriptions of how to apply those models to real-world situations. Dr. Pieters also sets aside time in class for us to apply the models to real-world events and trade disputes in a safe, protected environment (i.e. we have room freely make mistakes so we can be gently corrected and sent into the world with an appropriate understanding of how trade works instead of a self-assured yet incorrect understanding).

- There seems to be an awful lot of material that the class is trying to teach. I enjoyed the in class discussions of news articles and current events, but it feels like the class is always in a hurry and that we are not going as in depth into current events as we could. It would be interesting if Dr. Pieters would slow down and make more time to discuss the current issues in international trade.

- Her ability to understand where we are having difficulty grasping a concept is uncanny. She really is a very effective teacher.

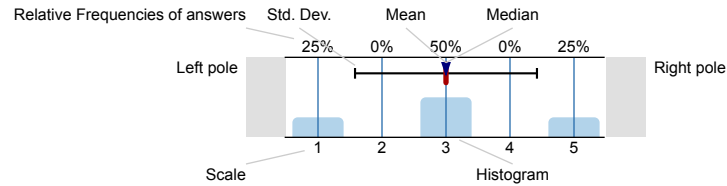

- Challenging but well taught class.
- Great class, most of class spent lecturing, assignments aren't too hard, material is taught well and professor has good office hours. Grading is fair
- Great course. Very interesting, Professor Pieters is also very efficient and professional.
- Great instructor. Met my desire to learn more about econ.
- I had a very hard time in this class. I would say that lectures generally seemed easy to follow, but when I would go back to review my notes, I could not make sense of them. I think you often skim over what you assume we know instead of explaining everything in its entirety. It is almost like this course was designed as a review for students who have taken microeconomics before. When I spoke to other students who have taken micro, they could not even make sense of my homework or out class lectures. I think the homework should have more questions that test our very basic knowledge of the concepts instead of applying these concepts in ways which were extremely difficult without your help. Our homework would have been more helpful if it quizzed us on lectures and notes directly, I feel like I would have gotten concepts more easily.
- I was not used to the teaching style as the instructor did not go in depth to explain many concepts during lectures. A lack of explanation resulted in much confusion during class periods. She assumes that we should know about new materials and should be able to understand it right away. Positive reinforcement is never employed during or outside of class. Very disappointed that I chose this professor. The class is mildly interesting.
- It was a very well run course. Very efficient I was able to learn a lot in each 50 min class.
- Material was taught in a very organized, methodical, and in a way that made it easy to understand.
- Microeconomics is a difficult course in general, but I learned a great amount this semester through Dr. Pieter's effective teaching methods. She knows the material like the back of her hand and teaches you exactly what you need to know.
- Obviously economics isn't for everyone, however, I found this course to be relatively easy. Everything was thoroughly explained. Personally, I love math so I know certain aspects of this course came easy to me where as others struggled.
- The course was more difficult than I had originally expected. In spite of that fact I recognize that it was due to a lack of preparedness on my part, and when I decided to focus more on the course and become more prepared the teacher was readily available. I believe that the instructor herself is a good enough reason to take this course, which by no means indicates that the course is easy, though in my first year of college having this class was a good experience in the way of studying and being able to learn from a professor who is knowledgeable.
- The things that were taught in class and the way we were taught how to solve problems, proved to be irrelevant on the exams due to the curve ball style questions that were given to us to insure that "not everybody gets and A". Homework assignments did not help with understanding material for exams either.
- This class was relatively challenging for an microeconomics class and I noticed it was a lot more difficult than my peers' similar sections, however, unlike my peers I have a true understanding of the economic principles. Professor Pieters did a good job of making the class difficult, but as long as you went to office hours and sought help it was a lot easier.

- The professor quite obviously has put in a lot of thought into how the material is presented and not just what will be presented. I think the professor has done very well with both.

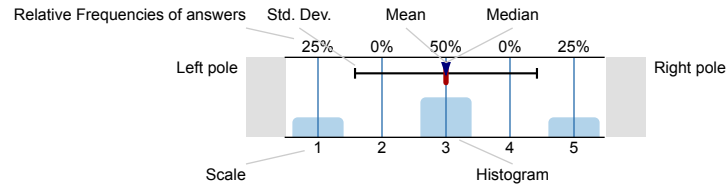

- Dr. Peiters has been the best professor I have had a Trinity. she sparked my interest in economics so much that I have added an economics major to my Business major. She is very clear and thorough with her information and can explain any topic well. All of her lectures are not only informative but thought provoking. She gives many study materials to help students succeed and is incredibly organized and timely.
- Prior to taking this course I had heard that Dr. Pieters was the hardest Macroeconomics professor, but the best teacher. I have found that to be very true. I took Macroeconomics last year with different professor, and my experience with Dr. Pieters this semester has been extremely positive. She has a very effective teaching style that really resonates with my myself and with my class of no more than 8 people (a few people come like three times a month, so it's generally 5 or 6 of us). Her way of conveying the material is extremely effective, and I feel like I have learned much more about macroeconomics this semester than I did when I took it last semester. She is very knowledgeable about her subject and has a really positive attitude that definitely shows and translates into how she teaches. Additionally, I think that her use of outside sources, and the way she explains them to the class, is important to seeing how the information we learn is class is applicable to the real world. I have a much deeper understanding of the way the economy functions on a macro-scale after taking this course. Dr. Pieters is one of the best professors I have had at Trinity, and I have told everyone looking to take macroeconomics next semester that she can be difficult, but she teaches the subject extremely well. Even though I am intending to major in accounting, I am considering taking her for an additional economics course because of how interesting she is and how much I learn throughout her courses. Even when I am tired and struggling to stay awake in other courses during periods of high work, her class never fails to be interesting and fun and get me engaged with the material.
- The course was great. I took a Macro class in high school, but there was a lot more critical thinking and application in this course. I learned a lot more than I expected coming into this class and I am glad to have gotten a great professor.
- Very constructive lectures with nice tie ins to real world scenarios and statistics at the end of every segment. This helps to make every concept more tangible within the context of national and global economies. Dr. Pieters is knowledgable, enthusiastic, and well-prepared for every lecture. The primarily problem with the course is that all the knowledge we are tested on is contained within the lectures. I haven't had the need to go in for office hours, but that is really the only option if you miss a lesson. The information presented is an amalgamation of different textbooks so trying to find answers online rarely leads to anything relevant to the course, and this can make things difficult if you missed office hours or didn't take crystal clear notes. It definitely engages your attention during class, but the lack of alternatives was a little bit scary at times.
- What I find most interesting is that in this course, students can always relate what they have learned in class to what is happening in reality. It makes my learning in class very effective. Using the data base of FRED is a very helpful approach that helps me understand how the macroeconomic principles work in the real world. I think the relationship between our practice portfolios on Kapitall with our course materials is not very close... I thought we would learn something about the stock market, but we didn't. However, the disappointing performance of my stocks do reveal how economy fluctuated as a whole.

- Homework assignment submissions are always graded and returned in a timely fashion. I've made fairly good grades on the homework and have kept up with the notes, so I haven't had the need to attend office hours. I only had to contact Dr. Pieters once outside of class about an issue and was able to resolve it by the end of the day via email.
- I go to Dr. Pieter's office hours almost every week to ask questions about the homework. She is always very helpful and gives me the tools and knowledge to figure out the answer on my own. She never makes me feel stupid for asking a question.
- She is available for office a good portion of the week, and she is very helpful when visited. Her grading is very precise and my mistakes have been my own doing, while being accurately graded by her. She is also very organized. Her Tlearn is formatted in an understandable way that is easy to use, and she is very organized in class with her use of outside sources on the internet.
- The handouts provided on T-learn help me have a better understanding of the structure of every topic. The knowledge assignments and data analyses are closely related to what we have just learned in class. Besides, the interactions between students and Dr. Pieters on T-learn are very effective.
- The lectures were pretty straightforward and the professor was quick to answer questions via office hours or through the forum.
- When you go to her for help on a homework problem, she doesn't tell you the answer, she makes you think about it so that you make sense of it yourself.

- Her tests are very challenging. They have forced me to really know the materials and spend many days studying. You cannot know just an

overview of the topics and do well on her tests.
She also grades the homework in a timely manner and provides an answer key.

- The course is a very well taught intro level course. Like the course I took in microeconomics, it isn't very difficult or engaging material. But Dr. Pieters has done a nice job of tying much of the material to real-world political happenings, and frequently uses publicly available economic information and tools (such as FRED) in order to make the concepts relevant. I actually do feel much more understanding of the nuances of the global economy and my place in the world as an economically active citizen, something I didn't expect from an intro level economics course.

It doesn't demand much analytical thinking, however, as most of the material is referencing just referencing notes and plugging numbers into concepts and equations. The handful of problems that have been more involved always have great payoffs and I feel accomplished in completing them.

- The way that Dr. Pieters structures her course puts a huge emphasis on analytical thinking, especially through her homework assignments and tests. Her assignments require the application of what was learned in class, but on a deeper level that requires analytical thinking and a thorough understanding of the material in order to perform successfully on those assignments and tests. I like that her homework isn't simple and cookie-cutter multiple choice, which actually lead to learning of the material in class. I have learned a great deal in this course and have recommended it to everyone if one wants a challenge, but a really good professor.
- There's a great deal of thinking in this class and the professor really challenges you to develop your skills.
- This course is very thought provoking, because we will always face different situations of the economy in the future. The various topics in this class provide a rational way for us to view it.

- The teacher definitely demonstrates a love for teaching and what she does. It is fun when the teachers get excited about what they are talking about because it makes you excited.

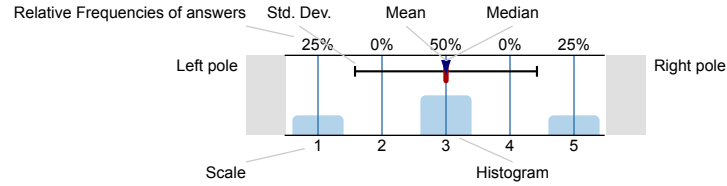

1. Background Questions

^{1.7)} Considering your selections above, please comment on your experience in this course.

- Dr. Pieters is an excellent professor. I feel that too often my Econ classes have been theory-based with little connection to the real world. She effectively merges the theory and real world by challenging her students to think critically about real examples. I really enjoyed how she encouraged group work in the homework and student-created midterm. The research paper at the end was time-consuming, but allowed me to explore my interests and gain real analytical skills.
- I also chose this course because I wanted to test myself in an upper-division Economics class. If I did well, I'd definitely consider pursuing graduate school. If not, I'd reevaluate my plans after university.

However, my findings at the present moment aren't as black and white. Although this is a tougher course (by others' standards, one of the most difficult), I think more reflection is necessary for my intentions in pursuing graduate school.

Enough about me. I've taken Dr. Pieters before, and I knew that I'd have a very different experience in this course when compared to other courses at Trinity (especially those dealing with quantitative applications). I thoroughly enjoyed my time in class; learned a lot. I did, at times, cry tears of learning, but that was simply because I did not heed the warning about homeworks taking at least 6 hours to complete. I should have remembered.

Other than that, Dr. Pieters takes a very different approach to teaching that I enjoy. Sometimes I didn't want to participate, but I still had to anyway; which was good, because I learned.

- This class is very difficult. The workload initially is not very bad, but the term paper is something that you cannot take lightly. Dr. Pieters does well in building up your theoretical base and providing you with models to understand the movement of money around the world, but the course material is not entirely intuitive. The term paper requires a dedication to work on it for the long-term. You cannot finish it in one night, or even one week. That said, the class is super interesting and well-taught. I am very grateful for having been pushed to write my term paper as it has given me research skills, experience with Excel, and writing abilities that I would not have cultivated without this class. I recommend it to anyone who is willing to put in the effort.
- This course has taught me a lot of information in the short amount of time that is one semester. I was very impressed with the intellectual challenge of this course, the things I was forced to learn and adapt to in order to be successful (Excel), and the amount of real-world information learned in this course. The fact that this course was not taught out of a textbook (literally) gave me the sense that it was more real-world applicable. It's hard to explain, but I have had Econ courses that were clearly taught in an order outlined by a textbook. This course taught SO much material that kept on building from the very first day of class all the way to the end.

For the first five weeks, homework was a little more intense than I expected and I was forced to be in office hours every Tuesday for at least an hour. And then continue to spend hours on Excel solving the complicated problems posed in the homework. I think there was a lot of assumed knowledge that was expected of the students, and I think most of my classmates would agree to that. I learned more in Excel in this semester that everything I had ever known about Excel before this class. I learned more about foreign economics, exchange rates, investing, economic laws and theories, etc. than I thought possible in this amount of time.

However, this class has been very frustrating for me at times. The grading seems to be a bit extreme and unforgiving and unsympathetic. Dr. Pieters was SUPER helpful in office, and thank goodness for that, or I would be miserable failing. The term paper at the end of the semester is easily the most mentally demanding, time consuming, tough, and strenuous papers I have ever written. The research, the data, the excel data analysis, the comprehension of those components, and then writing about them is probably the toughest thing I have ever had to do in college. Having said that, some comments made by the professor on the assignments were very blunt and almost rude. (Four students dropped the course on the first day of class because of the intimidation that Dr. Pieteres brought on the first day... I guarantee that is the reason.)

Overall, a very interesting and intellectual course. I was surrounded by very knowledgeable students that taught me in addition to what Dr. Pieters taught. However, for a course that was not required for ANYTHING for me to be as hard and degrading and time consuming as this course was, I was a little annoyed and frustrated to say the least. It is upsetting to know that I may get a low B or C in a course that is not required at all.

- Great class, Dr. Pieters is a great professor

- It's hard to really enjoy a class you struggle in, but I thought that what we learned was unique from any class I've taken before.

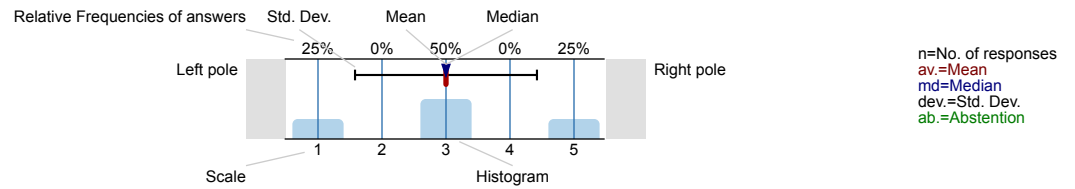

- Positive rating. Effective and to the point.

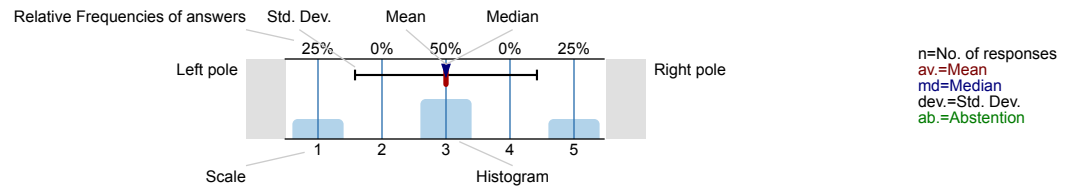
